

The Department of Sociology at Kent State University invites applications for a tenure track assistant professor position at East Liverpool campus in the area of criminology and justice studies beginning August 2012. We seek teaching scholars who are trained in criminology or criminal justice and are prepared to teach in at least two of the following areas: criminology, corrections, law and society, or policing. The department has specializations in the areas of social psychology, medical/mental health, inequality (race/ethnicity, class and gender) and criminology and deviance. We seek teacher-scholars whose teaching and research interests advance these areas of specialization and who have a strong interest in teaching.

A tenure-track appointment carries with it the expectations of teaching excellence, a developing research career, professional development, and campus and community service. The East Liverpool Campus is one of seven Regional Campuses of Kent State University and is located in Northeast Ohio about 40 miles west of Pittsburgh, PA. The Regional Campuses are designed to provide local access to a Kent State University degree. The faculty on the Regional Campuses teach twelve units per semester and are actively engaged in pedagogical innovation. The Sociology Department has twelve tenure track faculty at the Regional Campuses and twenty-one tenure-track faculty at the Kent Campus.
